This year's Annual Report is different from previous years. Due to the school closures, the government exams for the Provincial Achievement Exams and Diploma Exams as well as the IB Exams and the Canadian Achievement Tests were not able to be written. We report on this data each year. As such, this year's report only reflects teacher awarded marks.

Despite the changes, our students did well. I am very pleased to report that our Class of 2020 earned acceptances to 190 universities and more than MOP 10 million in scholarships!

What an unusual and dramatic year this has been - one that has demonstrated the strength, professionalism and collaboration from our teachers, students, parents and staff. TIS was able to mobilize its resources to adapt to the mandatory school closure, roll out an online learning platform and continue its curriculum and programs for our students. Our management team ensured that our campus and staff were ready in the event of school reopenings. As a result when this occurred, we were able to ramp up quickly, complete, and celebrate the school year successfully with all of our students and staff together.

Despite the extreme challenge in continuing the programs, our graduating class of 68 students accumulated over MOP 10 million in scholarships. As well, 33 percent of the graduating class received acceptances into the Top 50 Universities Worldwide, according to QS World University Ranking 2020. We would like to thank Mark Lockwood for his contribution to TIS over the past two years. During his tenure, we were able to achieve independent school status as well as navigate through the uncertainty of the Covid-19 pandemic, all while continuing to maintain the School's high quality education and standards. In addition, we are excited to introduce our new Head of School, Patrick Hurworth, who will be joining us for the 2021/2022 school year. As an Alberta Accredited International School, TIS undergoes a thorough on-site inspection every year which includes interviews, observations and surveys with parents, staff and students. Additionally, we participate in an annual Accountability Survey conducted by Alberta Education.

2019 Results

Due to the pandemic and the closure of many schools both within Alberta and internationally, the standardized exams and accountability surveys were cancelled by the Alberta Ministry of Education for 2019. The 2019 results are based on teacher awarded marks and survey results from our annual accreditation survey of parents, students, and teachers.

Areas of Excellence

TIS continues to achieve excellent academic results that are significantly above the average results for other schools. We are seeing more students achieve levels of excellence in their grade 12 exams and this directly relates to the higher quality of universities that they are being accepted to each year. In addition to academics, it is clear that students and parents have seen an improvement in our commitment to providing a safe and caring community and that TIS is preparing students to be global citizens. This year's continuous improvement measure is based on our facilities and resources as the previous survey was not administered.

Areas for Growth

At TIS, we are very proud of our community and how we all work together to improve the learning environment for our students. The pandemic and resulting closure of the campus and shift to online learning meant that there were limited opportunities for our parents to be involved at the school. While we were pleased to be able to reopen the campus before the end of the year, we were disappointed not to have our parents on campus as before. As we all learn how to connect and interact online, we find new ways to work together and we all look forward to when the campus can be fully reopened.

Student Learning

Grades 3-11 School-Awarded Grade Level Results

Due to the pandemic and school closures, the Alberta Ministry of Education cancelled all government exams. This included Grade 3, Grade 6 and Grade 9 Provincial Achievement Tests and the Grade 12 Diploma Exams. Due to the closure, we were also unable to administer the Canadian Achievement Test to students in grade 3-9.

Elementary School Summary

2019-20 was a unique and challenging school year for our primary learners. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, our students were required to move to an online learning format from February 2020 to mid May 2020. As a result of this interruption to the normal school year, no standardized tests were completed.

Our resilient teachers adapted to new ways of teaching, learning, and communicating. Daily, developmentally appropriate plans for live online instruction, supported assignments and regular contact with students and parents in all grades were provided. The focus was on reading, writing and math instruction, with projects that could be completed at home.

We are happy to report that many of our students participated fully in the online program, and despite the challenges that a distance learning program can present, our students all experienced growth in literacy and math.

Moving forward after last year's disruption, our approach is to rigorously ensure that all students are getting the support they need and that any existing learning gaps are being filled.

International Baccalaureate Programme

In addition to the Alberta High school Diploma, TIS also offers the International Baccalaureate® (IB) Diploma Programme (DP) as an option to its curriculum for Grades 11 to 12. The two-year IBDP is a challenging and balanced pre-university educational program that is recognized around the world. Students may seek an IB Certificate or an IB Diploma.

IB Certificate

Students may choose to take one or more IB Diploma courses without fulfilling all the requirements for a full IB Diploma. They receive an IB Certificate of completion for all IB Diploma courses studied. These courses are graded on a 1-7 scale, with 7 being the maximum grade. All IB Diploma courses have a set of externally graded assessments, ranging between 60-80% of the final grade. Internally assessed coursework undergoes external moderation by the IB prior to the release of the final marks.

IB Diploma

Students pursuing an IB Diploma are required to take six IB Diploma courses. In addition, as part of the IB Core, these students take a Theory of Knowledge (TOK) course and write an Extended Essay (EE), each of which are graded on an A-E scale. The achievement results in six IB Diploma courses are totalled, with 42 points available. Three points are available from the results of TOK and EE combined. The maximum total points attainable in an IB Diploma is 45.

The International School of Macao is a highly diverse and multicultural community. In the 2019-2020 school year, 40 countries/regions were represented in the TIS student population.


Student Numbers by Grade Level

TIS experienced steady growth in student numbers in 2019-20.







Teaching Faculty

All TIS teachers participate in a rigorous referral and interview process focused on identifying high quality applicants in all grades and specialty areas. We handpick beginning teachers, mid-career teachers and those with many years of teaching experience from a variety of countries. Additionally, each division includes teachers who are experienced with the Alberta curriculum and teachers with international teaching backgrounds.

Each year our diverse faculty reflects our global community and ensures that we have the expertise at TIS to meet our high quality curricular demands. In 2019-20, the TIS faculty included a total of 134 teachers from 17 different countries.










The TIS Advantage

TIS offers a holistic and student-focused approach to education where learning is valued, growth through diversity is encouraged, individual uniqueness respected and personal excellence is fostered by dedicated staff. Enriched programs, the latest technology and a supportive environment all contribute to the education of the whole student.



Extra Curricular Activities

TIS offers three extra curricular sessions over the course of the year. Students sign up for a multitude of ever changing activities including Lego Club, Primary Choir, Dodgeball, Watercolour Art, Ball Hockey, Volunteer Team and many more. TIS also invites many outside agencies to use our facilities and offers extended opportunities for students such as soccer, rugby and Macau Glee Club to name a few. Students enjoyed a rich and varied ECA session in the fall, however, the winter and spring sessions had to be cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



Athletics

The sports program at TIS continues to be one of the cornerstones of the TIS experience. Between the start of school and mid-November 2019, Tigers athletes competed in 16 overseas tournaments and dozens of DSEJ games locally in Macau. As always, our athletes competed with poise, passion, and vigor in each event, and were great ambassadors for our school by displaying sportsmanship and camaraderie on and off the sports field. In early November, TIS hosted the SCISAC U15 Soccer Tournament for the first time in our history.

Although the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a shorter athletic season, some DSEJ sports were able to resume in June. The TIS high school boys football team made history as they became the first TIS team to win DSEJ football gold. In the same week, our high school girls basketball team netted a silver medal in the DSEJ championship game.





Fine Arts

TIS provides many stimulating opportunities for students to explore and enhance their individuality and creativity through art, music, drama, photography and multimedia.

The theatre program offers students the chance to act, design and stage productions under faculty supervision. On November 29-30, the TIS Secondary Players performed their fall production of Once Upon A Crime to a sold out crowd.

Our kindergarten and elementary students showcased their talents at various Christmas concerts in December, while the grade 9 symphonic band performed at the annual Secondary Christmas Concert held on December 14th. In addition, the TIS Crescendo Choir toured the major hotels to perform classic holiday carols during the period leading up to Christmas.







Community Service

Over 300 people participated in the Run of Hope charity fundraiser on November 10, 2019. TIS has been an active partner and co-sponsor of the event for the past seven years. Inspired by Canadian athlete, Terry Fox, the Run of Hope brings together the TIS community in many ways, through participation, sponsorship and volunteering. A total of MOP 600,000 was raised at the Run of Hope with proceeds donated to the Kiang Wu Cancer Department and the China Evangeline Fellowship Orphanage in Macau.

At the end of November, TIS welcomed its second Activist in Residence, Songqiao Yao, whose organization Wildbound connects students to nature, inspiring them to take actions in China and globally. Students learned about sustainability and raised awareness of climate change and the importance of preserving biodiversity. Through its fundraising efforts, the TIS community raised a total of MOP103,522 which was donated to the Earth Innovation Institute to support its work in preventing deforestation in the Amazon, as well as Songqiao's charity, Wildbound, in support of its youth ambassador program.










University & College Placements

Thanks to its rigorous, well rounded curriculum and diverse learning opportunities, TIS graduates garner remarkable university acceptances worldwide and are highly sought after by international and local universities. The class of 2020's 68 students graduated with an Alberta High School Diploma. There were also five students who completed the full IB Diploma Programme at the same time. Research shows that having these certifications better equips students for the challenges of university study.

All of our students who applied to university have received direct admission offers to more than 340 universities and colleges around the globe, including highly ranked schools such as University of Oxford, University of Michigan, Imperial College London, University of Washington, University College London (UCL), University of Edinburgh, King's College London, University of Toronto, University of Hong Kong, and University of Melbourne.

This attests to the quality of the school's challenging programs and its growing global reputation in the university world. Our alumni are studying in diverse fields such as medicine, dentistry, law, engineering, business, architecture, design, film studies, music production, hotel management, education and many others. TIS graduates are also continuing their education in graduate schools and have earned acceptances to top universities for their postgraduate studies.

I still remember that back in high school, we had to choose the courses that we wanted to take for every semester. This process can really help students to understand and see better for themselves what they are interested in and what they are good at."

For Joy, attending TIS helped her to adjust easier to life at a Canadian university. "TIS follows the Canadian curriculum and everything we learned about was related to Canada. Therefore, when I got to Canada, I felt less alienated and I was able to adapt to the culture quite quickly."

John and Joy will both be finishing their degrees next year. John plans on pursuing a Master's degree and becoming a certified lawyer while Joy has her eyes on potentially becoming an aircraft mechanic or an airline pilot.

As Joy says, "Sometimes life is all about unexpected events so everything has a fair chance of happening."






Finances

As a non-profit school under the Macau University of Science and Technology Foundation, TIS seeks to maintain a balanced budget. All income received by the School is carefully spent to optimize an enriched and effective learning environment for all students.

The School is audited annually by the DSEJ and is also required to report its financial statements to Alberta Education.







TIS Becomes Independent International School in Macau

In September 2019, the Macau Education Department (DSEJ) gave its approval for TIS to become a licensed and authorized independent school in Macau. The change in status, which came into effect for the 2019-2020 academic year, allowed TIS to operate outside of the Macau educational framework and provide greater flexibility in expanding the School's international focus.

The transition was very smooth with no disruptions to existing protocols or the day to day operations of the school.

As an independent school, TIS continues to be held to a high standard of accountability by Alberta Education and the Macau Government. The School undergoes a rigorous accreditation and accountability process each year which includes on-site inspections, classroom observations, interviews with parents, staff and students, as well as participation in the annual Accountability Survey and submission of the Annual Education Results Report and 3 Year Plan. Students also participate in standardized exams in grades 3, 6, 9 and 12.



The Impact of COVID-19

Just before the Chinese New Year holiday, there were rumours about a new highly contagious virus. The School acted immediately and set up a temperature check and hand sanitizer station at the school entrance as a precaution. We were not expecting how quickly COVID-19 would affect the region and later the rest of the world.

At the end of January, DSEJ announced all schools in the Macau SAR would be suspended until further notice. The TIS Administration team met immediately and put into place procedures on how lessons could be continued with students off campus. TIS is fortunate to have excellent IT support which allowed us to move lessons online relatively quickly. However, it was still no easy task for teachers, students and parents alike to adjust to this new method of teaching on such short notice. As with any new program, teething problems were to be expected. Upper elementary and secondary students switched to online lessons with relative ease. Our younger students were a different story - the balance of non-screen time was certainly a challenge. Our strategy focused on ensuring the lessons were engaging, challenging, and flexible for the students, especially since some of our families were in a different timezone.

Schools remained closed throughout February and March. Enrollments which would normally take place in late February were postponed. The School continued to work with the IB Diploma and Alberta Diploma exam boards as the virus continued to spread around the world. Both would later announce that all external exams would be cancelled and




grades which would normally be based on external exam results would be awarded by internal grading by teachers. We are pleased to say that all of our students received their Alberta Diploma and our IB students scored above the world average. Despite the disrupted school year, all our graduating students secured admission to universities of their choice.

We are thankful that due to the strict border controls in Macau, the government was able to bring COVID cases under control and by mid-April schools were able to resume face to face lessons with staggered starts. By June, all elementary and secondary students who were in Macau were allowed back on campus. Although kindergarten classes could not resume, we were able to provide a family friendly program for eligible families following DSEJ guidelines. The School also continued online/recorded lessons for those students who were overseas and could not return to Macau.













Campus Development

TIS continues to refine and develop its campus through ongoing renovations of both wings and existing grounds. During 2019-20, the following projects and upgrades were completed:

- Replaced classroom/office doors on 4th floor SW
- Banks of lockers added to the South Wing
- Exterior work to repair grounds, water leaks, etc.
- Ongoing sidewalk repairs
- Installed CCTV system on the fence along outdoor basketball courts and front field
- Added furniture (couches and chairs) to all floors in SW and NW
- New wooden ship constructed for Kindergarten classes

In September of 2020, we will be combining all of our office systems to the North Wing office. This will make it easier for parents as they can go to the North Wing for all of their needs paying tuition, arranging buses, asking questions and making appointments.

Looking to the future, we will continue to refresh the South Wing learning spaces and find ways to update and improve our outdoor spaces. In 2020-21, parents can look forward to an expanded elementary STEAM lab and continued growth in the use of technology in the classroom.



























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
